Subject: The Revenue Department links social security data to level up public services

On 10th July 2020, 09.20 a.m. at the Somkiat Chayasriwong meeting room, 4th floor of Anekprasong building at the Social Security Office, the Revenue Department signed a memorandum of agreement with the Social Security Office on public sector integration (Big data). This data linkage brings together information on social security contributions, employers and insured persons. The ceremony received honour from the chairman, Labour Minister M.R.Chatu Mongol Sonakul.

Ms. Kanittha Sahamethapat, the Principal Advisor on Information and Communication Technology revealed that, "The Revenue Department and the Social Security Office have common intention to integrate the public services on sharing data together. This is to raise the public services and increase work efficiency, resulting in convenient, fast, and accurate services. The cooperation is under D²RIVE strategy (Digital Transformation, Data Analytics, Revenue Collection, Innovation, Values, and Efficiency) of the Revenue Department. This data linkage leans on Digital Transformation which emphasizes on application of Digital technology on working processes and services. Moreover, this is to promote highest convenience and enhance innovative working in order to upgrade the services to satisfy taxpayers and citizens. For this reason, the insured persons who claim for social security deductions since the tax year 2019 do not need to maintain documents and request for insured documents in order to deduct personal income tax allowance. In addition, these persons are able to check their social security deduction easily through the My Tax Account system at www.rd.go.th. Furthermore, the entrepreneurs do not need to submit the documents to the Revenue Department and the Social Security Office to reduce paper usage. The Revenue Department assures that data linkage via an electronic system between the Revenue Department and the Social Security Office will be a key mechanism to drive Thailand to become Digital Thailand."
